Often called the Galapagos of the Caribbean, the marine life-rich archipelago of Bocas del Toro is a utopia for ocean lovers. And for those who want to immerse themselves in the wonders of the archipelago, Nayara Bocas del Toro offers a sustainable retreat. Getting to the resort is easier than it seems—a 35-minute flight from Panama City will bring you to Bocas del Toro airport, and from there, it's just a five-minute boat ride to Frangipani Island. Choose to stay in one of 16 overwater bungalows or a whimsical, solar-powered treehouse designed by Ibuku's Elora Hardy.

Every inch of this property was intentionally devised to preserve the area's impressive flora and fauna. Days are spent paddleboarding or kayaking around the mangroves or lounging on an aerial beach that sits above emerald-green waters. The property offers tours of neighboring islands—with opportunities to spot dolphins, sloths, monkeys, caimans, rare tropical birds, and bioluminescence—as well as scuba diving, surfing, sports fishing, e-biking, and ATV adventures. In the evening, pad over to the property's fine dining restaurant in a century-old structure from Bali, where you'll find daily changing menus fueled by local ingredients.
